I am happy to announce that the "Together with Musicians" series will return on Jan 16 (Sat). Our third concert was initially scheduled to be broadcast in Nov. or Dec. However, this plan was delayed because of Christmas music celebrations. I have learned that virtual performances could demand more preparation and time than live ones.

Our third virtual show will be livestreamed on Jan 16 (Sat) at 7 PM Eastern Time. At this time, we will visit the Frederick Collection of Historical Grand Pianos. The founder and head of the center, Edmund M. Frederick, will give an introduction on the center and its historical pianos. I will interview Mr. Frederick, and we will give you an in-depth look into the five selected pianos (you will see their photos on page 2, below). You will have a rare opportunity to hear five piano pieces contemporary to the historical pianos, performed by five different pianists.

- 1907 Blüthner (Leipzig, Germany) -- S. Rachmaninoff's Prelude, Op. 23, No. 2, played by Daesik Cha
- 1893 Erard (Paris, France) -- M. Ravel's Sonatine, by Lucas Kammon
- 1859 Erard -- F. Liszt's "Funeral March", by Keith Kirchoff
- c.1830 Tröndlin (Leipzig, Germany) -- Robert Schumann's Romance, Op. 28, No.2, by Patricia Frederick
- c.1790 piano by unknown maker (Vienna, Austria) -- L. v. Beethoven's "Moonlight" Sonata, the first movement, by Edmund M. Frederick.

The virtual concert will be followed by a Zoom meeting for an interview with the founders of the Frederick Collection, and the guest artists.
